

## Sheffield Hallam Steam-Roller Flattens Donny

Sheffield's first-ever 18.30 start proved a successful one for the Abbeydale Park team when put on a fine display of steam-roller hockey at the expense of local neighbours Doncaster.

Last week both teams scored seven in victories over Deeside and Belper respectively and the hopeful turned up for a goal-scoring epic, but it did not happen.

Hallam were as organized as ever, with their rolling substitutions providing fresh legs every five minutes or so and their general level of fitness denying Doncaster any time to dwell on the ball.

Both sides pressed hard in the first minutes with Hallam's keeper Cachia pulling off a fine save three minutes in and up to the halfway point of the half neither side had found an effective way through the opposing defence.

Both teams had two penalty corners, neither of which were converted and it was Hallam, who always looked the more likely to score, who broke the deadlock after 20 minutes.

Hallam moved the ball fast out of defence after a failed Doncaster attack and swiftly passed it to Musgrave on the left whose pass found Ebbage on the edge of the circle.

Ebbage's firmly struck shot beat the keeper but ricocheted off the post to the waiting David Smith who had no trouble pushing the ball into the net from five meters out.

Hallam's on-pitch celebrations were matched by those of the large crowd and from then on Doncaster had to work even harder to get back into the game.

Following the break the game entered a stalemate phase with Doncaster desperate to level the score but failing to find a way through the organized Hallam defence and Hallam were happy to maintain the 1-0 score line but were determined to score more.

Doncaster's play began to get a bit scrappy as frustration crept in while Hallam restricted any Doncaster possession by quickly closing players down when they had the ball.

It's possible that a goal for Doncaster might have brought them back into the game but to score they would have to move up a gear, a task that they couldn't do with the already high pace set by Hallam and it was not just about match Hallam's pace but bettering it.

The Hallam crowd went wild with joy when Welsh international Shaw converted Hallam's third penalty corner of the game with just ten minutes of the game remaining.

Shaw's powerful flick shot in the top left hand corner of the net killing off any lingering hopes that Doncaster may have had of salvaging anything from the game.

During the remaining minutes it was all Hallam as the home side had chance after chance the most notable being Musgrave's barrage of reverse stick shots that Donny keeper Watson just about kept out.

Mike Shaw finally ended all Doncaster resistance two minutes from the end when he scored his second penalty corner flick of the game, this time at the second attempt.

Hallam's 3-0 score line reflected the dominance they had during the game and it is the goals against column that tells the real story of this game.

Doncaster looked much better than they did the week before when they easily won 7-2 against a disappointing Belper side but they had no answer to Hallam's organization in defence and the pace at which Hallam could build attacks once in possession of the ball.

For Hallam this win puts into second place after two matches with only themselves and, North Conference leaders Brooklands MU, the side relegated from the premier last season, as the only teams in the division not to drop points in the first two matches.

This week Hallam travel to tricky Leek (14.00 start at Leek High School) who in the past have proved difficult to beat on their own pitch.

Leek started with a good 5-3 win against Barford Tigers but failed on Saturday when they lost 2-1 away at Belper.

Hallam will play with the total commitment and pace that has become a hallmark of their game and as one of the fancied teams in the league will be expected more glory.

Olton & WW had Denise Marston-Smith and Emma McCabe to thank for each scoring twice in a 4-0 victory over a depleted Leicester side. Although Leicester have been without several of their international players the previous two weeks, they will perhaps not have anticipated two defeats having conceded nine and scoring just once. Local rivals Reading and Slough played on Sunday as a part of a double header for Reading which saw the home side's male counterparts play later in the day. In a close fought fixture, it was Rebecca Halle that sealed the win for the home side at Sonning Lane, in the 60<sup>th</sup> minute, which meant Reading joined Clifton in gaining six points from two games; they sit second on goal difference.

## Clubs and Schools Competitions Review



Over the past 12 months, England Hockey Board (EHB) has been reviewing the EHB Junior Competition Framework, which encompasses junior club and school competitions.

This review follows on from the decisions in 2008 to bring the junior schools and clubs competition programme in line with the principles of the Single System.

As a result of the continued research and progress around player development and retention, and the considerable feedback from schools, we feel it is appropriate and advantageous to players, coaches, teachers and the sport as a whole that we propose a revised framework for Junior Schools and Club Competitions.

### Consultation Completed

Initially, EHB was planning to have the new framework in place for 2011/12 (as stated in the Junior Competitions Review Statement released in December 2010), but following consultation at the Single System Strategy Committee (SSSC) meeting (held on 29th January) and the EHB Board meeting (held on 31st January) the decision was taken by both groups that further consultation was required on the framework. The consultation was open to all clubs, schools and CHA and RHA representatives and involved 8 evening sessions held nationwide plus an online questionnaire.

This consultation will direct the extent of the change implemented for the 2011/12 season, but at this stage due to the tight timescales for competition planning and match scheduling for next season, it is not envisaged that any major changes will be made. Instead the discussions have focused on shaping the changes proposed for the 2012/13 season.

### Process from Here

Responses from the consultation are now being analysed and the timescales from here are as follows:

- Late Apr / Early May 2011 - responses will be analysed
- Mid May 2011 - final 2011/12 and 2012/13 frameworks drafted and discussed at Single System Strategy Committee
- Late May - frameworks approved by EHB Board
- Early June – 2011/12 framework published, along with all necessary information and entry details
- By March 2012 – 2012/13 framework published, along with all necessary information and entry details

Looking forward 2012/13, EHB is keen to ensure that we have the new Junior Competitions Framework fully in place, so that we are able to offer all young people participating in hockey the right competitive opportunities, to suit their age and ability. This is key if the sport is to fully capitalize on the unique opportunity provided by the London 2012 Olympics to generate extra interest at all levels.

### VIEWPOINT: OUT OF AFRICA

## Viewpoint: Out of Africa

Reflecting on the state of hockey in Africa after its Olympic Qualifier [www.fih.ch](http://www.fih.ch) September 29th, 2011

The dust is settling over the Matabeleland savannah where the African Olympic Qualifier was held in Bulawayo earlier this month. The African sunsets are beautiful with the sky tinged with orange and pink coloured brushstrokes.

Reflecting on the tournament and the African Hockey Federation's

Congress there are some very positive rays of sunshine with the shadow of some looming clouds.

On the positive side there is no doubt in my mind that in the men's competition the playing gap between South African and Egypt on the one hand, and Ghana and Kenya on the other hand has narrowed.

There were many tight games and the emerging talent is impressive. Zimbabwe's hockey is on the way back but they simply have not had sufficient international exposure in recent years and cannot be expected to compete at the same standard in the short term. Knowing the talent they have we expect very tough competition ahead.

Nigeria and Namibia's absence from the tournament, given their potential, was disappointing.

On the women's side sadly the gap has not closed significantly and South Africa remains dominant but there is no doubt that Ghana and Kenya are improving and the Zimbabwe team showed encouraging signs.

Once again Nigeria and Namibia's absence could not have helped their hockey standards and certainly "hurt" the tournament.

Regarding the umpiring there were some impressive performances but in general the standard needs to be lifted and more international exposure is needed.

The tournament also illustrated that Africa has some very competent and promising technical officials but again clearly more international exposure is needed.

African Hockey like the Continent itself has enormous potential. We all know the challenges that the Continent faces and the responsibility that rests with the African Hockey Federation to broaden and intensify development, improve playing standards, governance and administration in its member national associations.

However, these efforts are likely to be sorely tested unless all the members fully support the initiatives, compete in tournaments and participate in Congresses and forums.

Our destiny lies in our own hands and despite generous offers of assistance from the FIH and European Hockey Federation, it is the hockey community of Africa that must shape its own destiny.

Like carving a sculpture from marble this requires hard-work and dedication.

An example of what can be achieved was the magnificent work of Senator David Coltart, Zimbabwe Minister of Sport, Gavin Stephens and his local Organising Committee and the Hockey Association of Zimbabwe for restoring the Khumalo Stadium to its magnificent former glory and running a top quality tournament.

## European Hockey League to trial "stick above shoulder" rule in 2011-12 season

Change designed to add "extra excitement" to Euro Hockey League

**Airborne: Will the sticks be going even higher this season?**

The Euro Hockey League has continued its reputation as the most innovative competition in world hockey by trialling yet another rule variation for the 2011-2012 season.

In the past, a number of game-changing concepts began life in the EHL before either being adopted universally or used in FIH World Level events by the International Hockey Federation. These include the two minute Green Card suspension and the "Self Pass", which is arguably the most significant change to the sport since the removal of the offside rule two decades ago.

This season, the Euro Hockey League continues to push the boundaries by adjusting the rules regarding playing the ball above the shoulder.

Under the FIH Rules of Hockey 2011, Rule 9.7 states that "Players must not play the ball with any part of the stick when the ball is above shoulder height except that defenders are permitted to use the stick to stop or deflect a shot at goal at any height."

The new Euro Hockey League ruling allows a player to "stop, receive and / or deflect the ball in a controlled manner in any part of the field when the ball is above the shoulder". However, players must not play the ball dangerously or in any way that leads to dangerous situations for any player. The change is expected to add an extra element of excitement to this fantastic tournament.

## EuroHockey Nations Championships 2011: Olympic Qualification update

### Three men's and two women's teams reach London 2012

A brilliant week of action at the EuroHockey Nations Championships saw many twists, turns and certainly a few shock results. Europe's finest men's and women's international sides gathered at the Warsteiner Hockeypark in Mönchengladbach to fight not just for the right to be crowned as champions of Europe, but also to secure their place at the greatest show on earth – the London 2012 Olympic Games.

#### Race for the Games

Five Olympic berths were up for grabs at the tournament, with three being available in the men's tournament and two in the women's competition.

On the men's side, newly crowned European champions Germany will be joined at the London 2012 Olympic Games by tournament Silver medallists The Netherlands. The two giants of the world game have won four out of the last five Olympic titles, and will surely be two of the teams to beat in London. Both coaches – Germany's Markus Weise and Paul van Ass of The Netherlands – are building teams which they believe will be able to challenge the dominance of Ric Charlesworth's Australia. The high quality displays produced by both teams during the EuroHockey Nations tournament suggests that they could well be capable of doing just that.

Despite being pipped to the Bronze medal by England (who as part of host nation Great Britain had already qualified for the Games), the third Olympic qualification place was taken by Belgium. Colin Batch's rapidly improving team were superb throughout the tournament and claimed a place in the Semi Finals by defeating 2008 Olympic Silver medallists Spain, forcing their opponents into the draw for the Olympic Qualifying tournaments that take place early next year. It is not the first time that Belgium has shocked higher ranked opposition at the Euros. In 2007, they defeated then world champions Germany in the Bronze medal match, with Germany eventually booking their place at the 2008 Games by winning the Olympic Qualifier in Kakamigahara, Japan. Although they will be hugely disappointed not to have achieved Olympic qualification in Mönchengladbach, Spain will take comfort from the fact that the reigning Olympic Champions were also forced to do it the hard way.

The Netherlands continued their brilliant form in the women's tournament, claiming the European title with a 3-0 victory over fellow London 2012 qualifiers Germany. The Netherlands defeated England in the Semi Finals to book their place at the Olympics, while a late Natascha Keller strike provided even more misery for Spain, whose women will now also need to win an Olympic Qualifying tournament in order to reach London 2012.

The Netherlands were shocked in their second match of the tournament in Mönchengladbach, losing 1-0 to eventual Pool A winners Spain, but quickly regained their composure to win all of their remaining matches including a superb display in the final against Germany. Few can argue that the Dutch are the most informed team in world hockey currently, and look to be favourites to defend the Olympic title that they won at Beijing 2008. Germany showed great improvement at the Euros, and in the incredible and seemingly ageless Keller – named the tournament's Most Valuable Player – they have a true superstar.

#### Second chance for European Teams

The dream of reaching the London 2012 Olympics is still very much alive for many of the European teams. No less than eight European men's teams will get the chance to play in the Olympic Qualifying tournaments that begin early next year. These will be the four teams in Mönchengladbach that did not achieve direct qualification for the Olympic Games (Ireland - 5<sup>th</sup>, Spain - 6<sup>th</sup>, Russia - 7<sup>th</sup> & France - 8<sup>th</sup>) and the four highest ranked teams (not including Scotland or Wales) from the Championship II in Vinnitsa (Czech Republic - 1<sup>st</sup>, Poland 2<sup>nd</sup>, Austria - 4<sup>th</sup> & Ukraine - 5<sup>th</sup>).

Nine European sides will feature in the women's Olympic Qualifiers. The five teams that did not directly qualify for the Olympic Games in Mönchengladbach - Spain (4<sup>th</sup>), Belgium (5<sup>th</sup>),

Ireland (6<sup>th</sup>), Azerbaijan (7<sup>th</sup>) and Italy (8<sup>th</sup>) - will be joined by the four highest ranked teams (not including SCO or WAL \*\*) from the Championship II in Poznan. These are Belarus (2<sup>nd</sup>), Russia (3<sup>rd</sup>), France (4<sup>th</sup>) & Ukraine (5<sup>th</sup>). In other Olympic qualification news, the women's team of Australia and New Zealand have had their places at the London 2012 Games confirmed due to the withdrawal of Fiji from the Oceania Cup.
