

Durham Uni Keeper Wins Them the Points...

...but Sheffield Hallam stay top of EHL Men's Conference North!

Sheffield Hallam Men faced their toughest match so far this season when Durham University came to Abbeydale Park on Saturday and home team hopes of a sixth consecutive win and a clear lead at the top of the division came crashing down.

The Durham students are always slow starters and they have already lost one and drawn one game early in the season before this encounter but have made good use of the time in between to iron out the wrinkles.

They have already played and beaten the other side, Brooklands MU, who are expected to in contention come the end of the season and this meeting against Sheffield Hallam provided the best chance yet of moving closer to the top of the table.

Durham won the division last season but failed to gain promotion to the elite Premier Division in the end of season play-offs so Hallam that it would be no easy task ahead of them.

In the early part of the match Durham pressured Hallam and forced the home side into mistakes, This was a cosh that Hallam are more used to putting opponents under rather than being on the receiving end themselves and it threw the normally efficient Hallam machine into some disarray.

The first real chance of the game went Hallam's way after 21 minutes when Duncan Longson had two shots well saved by the Durham keeper at the first penalty corner of the match.

Durham responded by immediately moving play down to the Hallam end of the pitch where they too forced a save from Hallam keeper Cachia from a slick penalty corner move.

Two minutes later Durham were in front after a good flowing move down the right ended with a simple tap-in goal for Matthew Hodgson.

Both sides had further penalty corners towards the end of the same Durham fluffed theirs but hall am once again forced the Durham keeper to make a good save.

After the break Durham came with determination knowing that they had put Hallam under unaccustomed pressure in the first period and almost immediately they went two up as Mark Galloway slotted home an early penalty corner.

Five minutes later Hallam's nemesis from last season's games between these two sides in the form of Daniel Coultas put Durham three up when a rash challenge in the circle led to a

penalty stroke put away by Coultas with pin-point accuracy.

Three nil up, twenty minutes to go and hall am seemingly unable to find a route to goal, many of the faithful watching this tense match must have thought that was it.

It wasn't. Hallam's strength over the past two seasons has been their fitness and ability to keep going at pace for the whole match and many of their games have either been won in the last quarter with many goals being scored during this period.

During the last 15 minutes Durham were under constant pressure defending with all eleven players back and shelling the ball anywhere down the pitch just to break up Hallam's merciless attacks.

Even at ten minutes to go it seemed that Hallam still had the chance to salvage something form this game and as has been seen in the past in hockey two or three goals can easily come in a five minute spell.

Durham can thank their keeper, Adam Williams, for an outstanding performance in the last quarter that undoubtedly earned all three points for his side.

Hallam's Mike Shaw did score from a penalty corner with four minutes to go but it was too little too late to prevent Sheffield hall am slipping to their first defeat of the season.

The good news is that Sheffield Hallam are still top of the division on 15v points with Brooklands MU, held to 3-3 draw at Leek, in second place on 13pts and Durham, also on 13pts in third.

There are no matches this week and on 6 November Hallam are away at bottom club Barford Tigers followed by a home game against Belper before they face Brooklands in Manchester.

Hopefully the defeat against Durham will have toughened the team up so that when face Brooklands they will be ready for another stern test of their skills.

As the half wore on Hallam started to gain the upper hand and Durham's composure started to break down but the home side could not find a route to goal due to stout Durham defensive play and good saves from their keeper.

OLYMPIC HOCKEY PITCH UNVEILED

The London 2012 Organising Committee (LOCOG) today unveiled the Olympic Hockey Centre's first blue and pink pitch and revealed that a yellow ball will be used during the Hockey competition for the first ever time at an Olympic Games.

The Hockey Centre in the Olympic Park will host over 780,000 spectators during London 2012 staging both Olympic Hockey and Paralympic 5 and 7-a-side football competitions. The Great Britain women's hockey squad got the chance to train on the water-based pitch, allowing them a taste of what to expect next year. The main



competition pitch is now complete and will be used for Olympic Hockey and 7 a-side Paralympic Football. The Hockey warm-up pitch which doubles up as the 5 a-side Paralympic Football competition pitch is due to be completed in early November. The erection of the stands and infrastructure will follow in early 2012.

David Luckes, Head of Sport Competition at LOCOG, said: "We are delighted with how the main pitch at the Hockey Centre looks. The blue and pink pitch combined with the yellow ball will not only make following the ball easier, it also has a fantastic London 2012 feel. The player feedback has been excellent and we will continue to work together to ensure the pitches are perfect for the Games next year."

Leandro Negre, President of the International Hockey Federation (FIH), commented: "It is very exciting to see the Hockey Centre now taking shape and seeing the blue pitch for the first time. We feel confident that the spectators both in the stands and on television will get a fantastic visual experience."

Alex Danson (pictured below playing for England against the Netherlands) from the Great Britain women's hockey squad also commented: "It is great to be able to train on the pitch that we will be playing on during London 2012. Coming in to the Olympic Park makes everything very real and the excitement is really building within the squad. Having the blue and pink pitch for London 2012 is fantastic for hockey. The pitch is great to play on too; it's really quick and true and enables us to play with confidence. I can't wait!"



Jeff Davis, the FA's National Development Manager for Disability Football, commented: "We're hoping that Paralympic Football will be a big draw at London 2012 and I'm sure the brand new pitch and Hockey Centre will help create an exciting atmosphere for fans and players alike."

This will be the first time Olympic Hockey and Paralympic Football are played on a different colour pitch to the traditional green. The move to blue pitches will provide high levels of contrast with the yellow ball and white lines for players, officials, spectators, photographers and broadcasters.

The Hockey Centre is a temporary stadium based at the northern end of the Olympic Park. The centre will be the only full outdoor venue with seating for 16,000 spectators who will enjoy stunning views south across the Olympic Park.

The complex includes two pitches, one for competition and one for warm up. The main pitch will stage all of the 76 hockey matches which will be spread over 14 days of competition from 29 July to 11 August. There will be over 380 competitors from 24 teams competing in the men's and women's competitions.

The Hockey Centre will also be used to host both the 5 and 7-a-side Paralympic Football Competitions. The warm up pitch at the Hockey Centre will host the 5-a-side competition. The main pitch will host the 7-a-side competition. Competition runs from 31 August – 9 September 2012.

After the Games, the temporary arena will be dismantled and elements will be moved to Eton Manor in the north of the Olympic Park which will offer multi-purpose sport and leisure facilities including two hockey competition pitches.
