

Durham Run Ragged By Hallam

Hallam's heroes turn it on in the second half to totally outplay Durhams 2nds' Finest

This was the proverbial game of two halves as Sheffield HDurham Run Ragged by Hallamallam struggled to find any sort of fluent play in the first period and totally dominated in the second.

While they struggled early on Durham uni were not much better and the game became bogged down in a dull midfield tussle with neither team rising to the occasion.

The first half was not without its good points and scares, brilliant and decisive goalkeeping from Tiff Berry kept Hallam well in the hunt and Nicola Cox was outstanding in midfield often preventing Durham any sort of consistency but there pretty much any semblance of cohesive Hallam play foundered.

The turning point in the game came a minute before the break when Hallam finally found a bit of pace to move the ball around and a build up featuring the fearless Emma Fearnley led to Sophie Elsworth finding space in the circle for a quick shot that was partially saved by the Durham keeper but snapped up on the rebound by Alex Busk Wood.

This goal will have made the half time talk easier as the coach could focus on the positives that led to the goal and the team proved that this was the case when they came out for the second half.

Where Hallam had been listless with passes often going astray in the first period, the contrast at the start of the second was marked with a sharpness and determination that has not been seen too often this season.

Right from the off Hallam ran Durham ragged and goals could have come in the first five minutes.

They didn't, and the now eager crowd had to wait for an action packed ten minutes before Hallam got the break they badly needed.

Youngster Tori Wensley, recently returned from playing in the Futures Cup for the Pennine Pumas team, gathered the ball near the half way line, worked it down the sideline past two stick-flailing defenders and crossed it to Alex Busk Wood at the top of the circle.

Alex's first time shot nut-megged the keeper and ended up crashing into the backboards to give Hallam a by now well-deserved 2-0 lead.

Sheffield were cruising now and every one of their players stepped up their game to proceeded to dominate the match giving Durham few crumbs of comfort.

During the mid-part of the half Hallam came close on a number of occasions forcing last ditch tackles and saves from the Durham keeper but no further goals.

Alex Busk Wood came close with a flick at goal after good approach

work form Wensley and Elsworth was also in the thick of things in the Durham circle.

It wasn't all Hallam. Durham did get into the Hallam 25 and most notably missed an easy open goal after 55 minutes when Hallam keeper berry did just enough to put the Durham forwards off.

Some inconsistencies in the umpiring did threaten to derail Hallam's efforts but the team stuck to their guns and got on with the task of winning against one their North Premier Division top end rivals.

There was a final flurry of action in the last five minutes with a couple of penalty corners to Sheffield.

Kath Hughes put the game totally beyond Durham's reach with yet another trade mark near post penalty corner tap-in to make the score 3-0 in Hallam's favour and it could have been four had Fearnley's close miss at an overtime penalty corner found the corner of the net.

Hallam will be happy with result and will be happy that they finally found a vein of form missing in recent weeks.

This week they travel to third-bottom club Brooklands Poynton 2nds where they play right after Hallam Men's 1s crucial top of the table EHL North Conference clash with second place Brooklands MU.

Sheffield Hallam women will relish the chance to play against Brooklands P 2nds, a side that managed only four goals to date in their eight league matches and have conceded 35 even though they have won one and drawn one.

Division leaders Ben Rhydding put nine past Brooklands last week and Hallam will need three points this week to pull them back into the top three and plenty of goals if the title race goes down to goal difference.

Sheffield Hallam M1s cannot seem to stop scoring goals!

Seven this week against Belper brought their tally over the past four games to 24 even though they only scored one against Durham two weeks ago.

To be fair the way the M1s are playing (again) this season meant that this result was not unexpected and with just one team yet to play in the EHL Men's North Conference a pleasing pattern has emerged.

The bottom five clubs in the division have collectively conceded 35 goals against Hallam in five games with 10 goals going the other way.

Quite impressive from Hallam's point of view and very necessary if they are to win the division.

While Hallam would have to suffer a catastrophic loss of form to lose against the lower sides in the division its not these games that matter it's the matches against their main rivals that are all important.

Of the four other side is the division Hallam have beaten Doncaster 3-0 at home and Leek 4-2 away but lost to third place Durham University 3-1 at home.

This week Hallam travel to Brooklands MU, the only team they haven't yet played and this is possible the crucial match.

Hallam lead the division on 21 points with Brooklands and Durham lying second and third both on 19 points.

Brooklands MU were relegated from the Premier Division last season and constitute the biggest threat to Hallam's top spot tenure.

Brooklands have also been in good goal scoring form netting 33 times in eight matches and they have let in 14, one less than Hallam (Hallam have now scored 43 in eight games).

The game in Manchester this Saturday will be keenly contested and could be the match that goes some way to finding the division champions at the end of the season.

A Hallam victory would reduce their close challengers by one, putting a pleasing five point gap between the two sides and should Durham fail to beat fourth place Leek this week Hallam would have some clear ground at the top of the table.

Hallam defeat would mean at least Brooklands and possible Durham would go above them in the table.

Hallam started well against Belper although they did not use their early advantage as they have against other teams this season and they had to wait until the 17th minute for their first goal.

They had two penalty corners early in the match but failed to do anything with them and the large crowd had to wait until their third before they found the net.

It was another standard set piece with the ball injected to the top of the circle, stopped, pushed just into the circle, where Phil Roper's drag-flick sent the ball with pinpoint accuracy along the ground into the left hand corner of the goal.

Eight minutes later David Smith got on the score sheet when he was on hand to slot home from close range following good fast approach work from Hallam.

The 2-0 half time score line was probably fair but Belper had to work hard to keep it there and Hallam are renowned for strength in the last quarter of a game and this one didn't disappoint.

After the break things soon got moving when Roper once again drag flicked the ball along the ground at a penalty corner, this time the ball went in the centre of the goal.

Belper were now under severe pressure and they found it difficult to make any headway when they did have possession and often had to defend deep in their own territory, further goals were seemingly inevitable.

On 46 minutes Danny Berry stabbed the ball home in a melee in the circle and five minutes later Matt Gough on the penalty spot got a sweet narrow deflection on a shot from the edge of the circle to defeat the keeper and score Hallam's 5th.

The game continued in a similar vein before Belper scored from their first penalty corner of the match with ten minutes to go.

As the clock wound down there was flurry of activity with two minutes to go as three players were yellow card sin-binned in the space of 30 seconds leaving Belper two players down and Hallam one.

Almost from the restart following this Rhys Gowman scored a well worked goal for Hallam's sixth and as if this wasn't enough Tristan Gilbody made it seven with 30 seconds left on the clock.

Amazingly this was not the final action of the half as Belper immediately won an overtime penalty corner but couldn't repeat their goal scoring feat of nine minutes earlier.

More goals coring joy for Hallam, two moiré goals for Roper bringing his league tally to fourteen for the season but still leaves him in third top goal scorer in the whole league behind Ali Ghanzafar from Deeside on 17 and David Matthews of Canterbury on 15.

Once more it is worth noting the five other Hallam players got on the score against Belper.

Roper Fills His Boots

It was back to business and was very much business as usual last Sunday as Sheffield Hallam demolished Barford Tigers 8-1 at Hamstead School in Birmingham.

Barford lie at the foot of the EHL Men's North Conference, a position they have become used to over the years, one they usually scrape their way clear off by the end of the season.

This year could be different for the Midlands club.

Last season they only just saved their pelts but this year they could very well finish up as trophy rugs on the Midlands League floor (CITES allowing). They are very much an endangered species as far as the EHL is concerned.

The goal scoring lion for Hallam this week was Phil Roper who

weighed in with a hefty five goals, three from penalty corners and two in open play.

His first was scored after just five minutes, the early Hallam goal seems to be becoming a trademark of their play this season and his last goal was scored with under two minutes left on the clock.

This may have been Roper's safari but he was ably assisted as ever by Mike Shaw, Danny Berry and David Smith.

Hallam were three up at half time and cruising but they really punished Tigers in the second period with a further five goals, three of which came in the final eleven minutes.

This is Hallam's second eight-goal haul of the season and gives them an average score per game of 5-2, an improvement on last season's final tally of 4 for 1.6 against and with 36 goals from just seven matches they could be on course to beat last season's 71 goals from 18 games.

Phil Roper stays in top spot in the Hallam goal scorers charts with 12 goals increasing his lead over second-place Mike Shaw (now on seven) to five with David Smith third on five.

Hallam Uni student Roper might be top of the class as far as goal scoring goes but it is the fact that eleven players have scored so far for Hallam in seven games that is the heartening statistic.

Hallam return to Abbeydale Park for a match this Sunday against Belper (14.00 start).

Belper made a poor start to the season losing 7-2 away at Doncaster but they have picked themselves up since then and currently lie sixth in the ten-team table although the bottom three clubs are well adrift of the rest.

Belper should provide good opposition for Hallam as they are a composed side with a wealth of national league experience.

GB WOMEN GET WORLD #1 NETHERLANDS IN CHAMPIONS TROPHY

The FIH announced today the match schedule for the Argentina FIH 2012 Champions Trophy to be played in Rosario, Argentina from January 28 – February 5, 2012.

Great Britain's women have been drawn in Pool A alongside new world #1 the Netherlands, Beijing Olympic silver medalists China and Japan.

It will be the 20th edition of the women's event and one that will carry several important story lines for the eight participating teams. First and foremost, the event will be the last major international tournament before the London Olympic Games in August 2012. Seven of the eight teams in Rosario have already secured their spot in the 2012 Games with only Japan having to go through the Qualification Tournament process.

The spotlight in Rosario is sure to be on host Argentina, which will look to take back its World Number One Ranking after faltering in the final game at its last two appearances in major events.

Argentina - Third time in a row winners of Women's Champions Trophy July 2010

Argentina, who won the 2010 Champions Trophy in Nottingham (pictured above), lost the 2011 Champions Trophy crown to Netherlands in June, and then dropped from the #1 position in the FIH World Ranking after losing against the United States in finals at the Pan American Games. The hosts will look to get back on track with the home-field advantage.



Argentina and the Dutch are in different preliminary round groups. The Netherlands is in Group A along with Great Britain, China and Japan. Meanwhile, Argentina is the top-seeded team in Group B which also features Germany, New Zealand and Korea.

Following the round robin preliminary round games, the teams will play in a cross-over quarterfinal, with the winner of Group A facing lowest-finishing team from Group B, and so on. From there, teams will move onto the semi-finals and finals in a simple knock-out format.

The preliminary round group play will take place from January 28-31 over three competition days. The Netherlands and China kick off the action with a 12:30 game on the 28th. The quarterfinals will take place on February 2 leading to the medal day on February 5.

North Hockey Women's League Creation of Divisions 2 for 2012-13

1. Promotions and relegations at the end of the season 2011-12 will take place as per the NHWL existing rule 6.

In general this is Winners of Div 2 East and Div 2 West will be promoted. Two or more teams, depending on the number of teams relegated from National League, will be relegated from Div 1 to their respective Div 2. The 5 County winners will join these relegated teams in their respective division. The Div 2 teams finishing in 2nd place downwards will fill the remaining places until there is a maximum of 12 teams in each division.

If a county league winner does not wish to take up the place in the Division 2 then the County Association should find a suitable replacement from the clubs affiliated wholly to that county. If this is not possible, then one less team will be relegated from the original Division 2.

2. The twelve Div 2 East teams will then be split into North East 2 and South East 2 Divisions to a maximum of 10 teams. The twelve Div 2 West teams will be split into North West 2 and South West 2 Divisions to a maximum of 10 teams.

3. If there are too many teams in a new division then the team(s) placed lowest in Div 2 East and/or Div 2 West will be relegated to their County.

4. If there are not enough teams in a division then the Counties will be invited to provide additional teams in the following order:-

North Women's Hockey League Rule 6

6. Promotion/Relegation

Generally, the champions of each division or league will be promoted and the lowest team relegated.

Premier: The North Premier Division champion team shall be promoted to the EHL.

North teams relegated from the EHL shall rejoin the NHWL Premier Division. The number of teams to be relegated to Division One will depend on the number of teams relegated from EHL.

Provided that no more than one team is relegated from the EHL, the second placed team in Division One shall be promoted to the Premier Division. In this case, the bottom two teams shall be relegated from the Premier Division.

Division 1: The teams relegated from the Premier Division shall be joined by the top team from each Division 2. After ensuring that the division has twelve teams, the surplus number of teams shall be relegated to their respective Division 2 for the following season, after which, they must either gain promotion back to Division One or qualify

via their County.

Division 2: There shall be two Division 2s made up from clubs in the following counties:

(a) Division 2 East – Durham, Humberside, Northumberland, Sheffield & District and Yorkshire.

(b) Division 2 West – Cheshire, Cumbria, Greater Manchester, Lancashire and Lancashire Central.

When promotions to and demotions from Division 1 have taken place, the county league winners, who must be a team from a club affiliated wholly to that county, will be promoted to their respective Division 2. The Division 2 teams finishing 2nd place downwards will fill the remaining places until there is a maximum of 12 teams in each division 2. Teams below that position will be relegated to their county league.

If a county league winner does not wish to take up the place in the Division 2 place, then the County Association should find a suitable replacement from clubs affiliated wholly to that county. If this is not possible, then one less team will be relegated from the feeder league.

East Grinstead avenged their EHL Championships Final defeat to Beeston last season with a 3-2 victory on Sunday in EHL Premier Division. Dave De Prez broke the deadlock in the 27th minute for East Grinstead to lead at half time. Patrick Schmidt and Adam Dixon scored within three minutes of each other to overturn East Grinstead's lead for Beeston, but, with nine minutes remaining Ashley Jackson netted his first of two from open play to restore parity. With the game entering the final stages, Jackson pulled out a trademark penalty corner goal gaining revenge for his side, the three points, and opening up a lead at the top of the division.

Cannock's title challenge faltered on Sunday following a 4-1 defeat by Loughborough Students. Loughborough took the lead through Owain Dolan Gray and stayed in front until the final whistle. Sam Ward added two either side of Richard Smith's for Loughborough with Cannock's Arjan Drayton Chana scoring a consolation goal for his side. Reading's Mantell brothers made the difference at Southgate, both chipping in with goals during their 2-0 victory. Simon Mantell opened the scoring in the 3rd minute and Richard closed it with a 48th minute penalty corner strike that moved their side up into fourth. Bowdon's second win of the season came at home against Hampstead & Westminster, who dropped to fifth in the table, whilst Bowdon moved to within a point of safety. On the stroke of half-time Simon Egerton equalised Hampstead & Westminster's 20th minute opener from Andrew Smith. Bowdon took the lead through Michael Hoare before Smith's second again drew the scores level. Cue Nigel Croke's game winning brace, first putting Bowdon ahead with thirteen minutes remaining and then scoring the winner with just a minute left after Dan Fox had restored parity for Hampstead for the second time.

In the final game of the Premier Division, Surbiton and University of Exeter came away with a point each. The first 35 minutes went without a goal and it wasn't until four minutes after half time that Robert Mugridge opened the scoring for University of Exeter. READING'S 100% RECORD CULL(EN)ED BY LEICESTER

Reading's 100%, and undefeated, record went by the wayside as a result of their away defeat at the hands of Leicester in the Investec Premier Division. Both sides saw strong play through their right hand sides with Sam Quek for Reading and Anne Panter for Leicester putting in notable performances. Leicester's Lucy Brown broke the deadlock in the first half to give her side a lead which they held at half time. Reading struck back with two goals in three minutes through Rebecca Halle and Liana Smith before Crista Cullen stole the show. Cullen scored from two – almost – consecutive penalty corners the first equalising Liana Smith's strike in the 44th minute and the second restoring their lead three minutes later. Cannock's failure to score marked their third game without a goal; they have scored just three in eight games this season. Clifton dropped to fourth as a result of their surprise 4-3 defeat at Sutton Coldfield and EuroCanterbury's win. Clifton found themselves three goals down at half time; Sarah Mills had opened the scoring after just three minutes and Jane Sixsmith followed that up with a brace before 17 minutes. Clifton, however shell shocked, fought back with an Els Mansell double that Zoe Leach added to in the 65th minute. Sutton Coldfield, not prepared to settle for a point, had Vicky Woolford to thank for a 67th minute winner that brought their third win of the season, just a point separates them from their current position of ninth and sixth place. Surbiton and St. Albans sit tied at the top of Investec Conference East following wins for both sides again this weekend. Rebecca van Berkel and Emma Teague added goals in the second half to see Trojans score more than three goals for the first time in 2011/12.

Now three points off the league leaders, they play host to Bowdon who were also the beneficiaries of a late winner last weekend; Nigel Croke's 69th minute penalty corner edging the Cheshire club into a 4-3 win over Hampstead & Westminster. The win was only Bowdon's second of the season but was certainly welcome as it took them to within a point of eighth and ninth placed sides Southgate and University of Exeter. The Exeter students earned an away point last weekend at Surbiton and are set to lay on a party for the visit of East Grinstead on Saturday evening. Find out all about their plans here.

The Premier Division's other students, Loughborough, produced the surprise result of last weekend with a comprehensive 4-1 victory over second place Cannock. Still seventh, Loughborough Students are now just two points off the top five EHL Championships playoff spots as they get ready to face Reading on Saturday. The Blues had their Great Britain Olympian brothers, the Mantells, to thank for their win at Southgate with both finding the net from penalty corners but they remain in a slightly unfamiliar fourth place. It's been a mixed start for Surbiton who have won three, drawn two and lost three of their opening eight and they face a Cannock side looking to avenge last weekend's defeat.

Along with Cannock's resurgence this season, Hampstead & Westminster's early form has been one of the talking points in the Premier Division. Despite the late defeat at Bowdon the London team still occupies the final Championships playoff spot going into this weekend's home match with Southgate.

Men's EHL Conference North

After a strong first half performance Great Britain went in at the break 2-0 up and Jackson's second made it 3-0, effectively sealing the win in the 45th minute. Although Tom Boon scored for the Belgians with just over ten minutes remaining Great Britain were good value for the win.

26 year old Ulsterman Gleghorne came off the bench to score Great Britain's opener on a night that also saw Surbiton defender Ken Forbes make his first appearance in British colours while Glenn Kirkham represented Great Britain for the 50th time. For Gleghorne, the match against fellow Olympic qualifiers Belgium marked a long awaited debut following his return from 11 months out with injury.

On a bitterly cold night in Belgium, Great Britain were by far the quicker out of the blocks, forcing an early penalty following good work from Surbiton's James Tindall. Ashley Jackson saw his effort saved by Belgium goalkeeper Julien Schoolans and it remained 0-0.

In the first half, Belgian attacks were few and far between but from their first penalty corner – in the ninth minute – Ken Forbes plucked the ball off the goal line at shoulder height. And the save was to prove important when four minutes later Gleghorne gave Great



Britain the lead. A fine pass from Reading's Richard Mantell found Gleghorne at the top of the circle and he did well to turn his marker before unleashing a rasping reverse stick drive that gave Schoolans no chance.

And Great Britain's dominance was rewarded again in the 19th minute as Ashley Jackson found his range with a penalty corner that flew high into the net. Jackson (pictured above celebrating a goal in Nottingham in 2010) was unlucky not to double his tally five minutes later when another penalty corner drag flick struck the post.

With the temperature dropping and underfoot conditions becoming slippery the second half was a more even affair.

Former World Young Player of the Year Jackson effectively sealed the result in the 45th minute when he left the Belgium defence with no chance, converting Great Britain's fifth penalty corner high into the net.

As the game entered its final stages Belgium began to come back

into the match and following a period of concerted pressure Tom Boon flicked low beyond James Fair to reduce the arrears. Fair had already made several good saves but could do little about Boon's effort.

Afterwards, Great Britain Head Coach Jason Lee said: "Both Ken Forbes and Mark Gleghorne did well tonight. It was great for Mark to get his goal having waited so long to make his debut. Overall I'm pretty pleased and looking forward to tomorrow."

The two sides will meet again at 12:00 noon GMT on Thursday.
