Sheffield Hallam's top of the table clash turned into the spectacular that the title deserved. The game had jsut about everything although from Hallam's point of view not quite everything!

Conditions were good at Brooklands MU's Sale headquarters, the sun was shining, the temperature was moderate and the teams were raring to go.

Brooklands came out of the traps like greyhounds and went straight at the Hallam defence and within four minutes they were 2-0 up thanks to goals from Kieron Mulholland.

While the goals were good they were not outstanding and it was more that they caught the usually pugnacious from the off Hallam cold.

Brooklands compounded Hallam misery with a third goal on eight minutes when the ball was gifted to a Brooklands forward on the 22 setting up a two-on-one that gave Hallam keeper Cahcia no chance as Mark Richardson flicked the ball home giving Brookklands a 3-0 lead..

At this point Hallam woke up and started to play their usual pulsating fast play down both wings and as soon as they got into their stride they put Brooklands well onto the back foot and showed why they started the day at the top of the division.

Hallam's top scorer Phil Roper was definitely player of the first half and his fast pace and quick change of direction often had three or more Brooklands defenders totally bemused as Roper and Hallam surged forward.

It wasn't long before Hallam were on the score sheet when the ball was moved down the right wing and crossed into the circle, past the defensive line to Danny Berry who had the easiest of jobs poking the ball home into an empty net from a range of two feet.

Four minutes after that Hallam were well back into the match when an almost carbon copy of Brooklands third goal occurred as Hallam gained possession as Brooklands tried to run the ball out of their own 22 and Dave Goodfield took possession.

He then ran the ball into the top of the circle, jinked left and slammed the ball home form an acute angle.

Eighteen minutes gone, 3-2 down, but Hallam were in the ascendant.

During the rest of the half Hallam kept up the pressure with first Roper shaving the outside of the post with a low penalty corner drag flick and then Ebbage came within an inch of scoring into an empty net but the ball unfortunately hit on the foot instead of the stick.

Brooklands did venture into the Hallam half and they did miss a much harder open chance than Ebbage's four minutes earlier but the clock ran down putting an end to an exhilarating, pulsating, game of hockey.

The second half could not have been more different in that it lacked the ferocity of the first.

The play was still fast and skilful but it seemed like batteries were now only half charged and play became more open and perhaps slightly slower.

One wonders how the match would have progressed had half time not occurred and whether Hallam would continued to dominate.

Seven minutes in to the second period Brooklands won a penalty corner and during the melee than ensued the ball was driven hard across the circle level with the penalty spot where the umpire adjudged that a Hallam players had pushed one of the Brooklands in the back and a penalty stroke was awarded.

Brooklands' David Seddon made no mistake flicking the ball hard and low with the keeper going the wrong way.

Hallam restarted the game after the fourth Brooklands goal only to go 5-2 down almost

North Hockey Women's League Creation of Divisions 2 for 2012-13

1. Promotions and relegations at the end of the season 2011-12 will take place as per the NHWL existing rule 6.

In general this is Winners of Div 2 East and Div 2 West will be promoted. Two or more teams, depending on the number of teams relegated from National League, will be relegated from Div 1 to their respective Div 2. The 5 County winners will join these relegated teams in their respective division. The Div 2 teams finishing in 2nd place downwards will fill the remaining places until there is a maximum of 12 teams in each division.

If a county league winner does not wish to take up the place in the Division 2 then the County Association should find a suitable replacement from the clubs affiliated wholly to that county. If this is not possible, then one less team will be relegated from the original Division 2.

2. The twelve Div 2 East teams will then be split into North East 2 and South East 2 Divisions to a maximum of 10 teams. The twelve Div 2 West teams will be split into North West 2 and South West 2 Divisions to a maximum of 10 teams.

3. If there are too many teams in a new division then the team(s) placed lowest in Div 2 East and/or Div 2 West will be relegated to their County.

4. If there are not enough teams in a division then the Counties will be invited to provide additional teams in the following order:-

North Women's Hockey League Rule 6

6. Promotion/Relegation

Generally, the champions of each division or league will be promoted and the lowest team relegated.

Premier: The North Premier Division champion team shall be promoted to the EHL.

North teams relegated from the EHL shall rejoin the NHWL Premier Division. The number of teams to be relegated to Division One will depend on the number of teams relegated from EHL.

Provided that no more than one team is relegated from the EHL, the second placed team in Division One shall be promoted to the Premier Division. In this case, the bottom two teams shall be relegated from the Premier Division.

Division 1: The teams relegated from the Premier Division shall be joined by the top team from each Division 2. After ensuring that the division has twelve teams, the surplus number of teams shall be relegated to their respective Division 2 for the following season, after which, they must either gain promotion back to Division One or qualify

via their County.

Division 2: There shall be two Division 2s made up from clubs in the following counties:

(a) Division 2 East – Durham, Humberside, Northumberland, Sheffield & District and Yorkshire.

(b) Division 2 West – Cheshire, Cumbria, Greater Manchester, Lancashire and Lancashire Central.

When promotions to and demotions from Division 1 have taken place, the county league winners, who must be a team from a club affiliated wholly to that county, will be promoted to their respective Division 2. The Division 2 teams finishing 2nd place downwards will fill the remaining places until there is a maximum of 12 teams in each division 2. Teams below that position will be relegated to their county league.

If a county league winner does not wish to take up the place in the Division 2 place, then the County Association should find a suitable replacement from clubs affiliated wholly to that county. If this is not possible, then one less team will be relegated from the feeder league.

SEASON REACHES HALF WAY STAGE

East Grinstead increased their lead at the top of the EHL Premier Division to four points on Saturday as we reached the midpoint of the season. Second bottom side University of Exeter failed to present a significant challenge for the leaders for whom Welsh international Rick Gay scored twice. Gay opened the scoring in the twelfth minute before rounding off the 2-0 victory in the closing minutes.

Beeston moved up into second place courtesy of a 4-1 win over bottom side Bowdon. Beeston were made to work hard early on after trailing to Nigel Croke's goal after just five minutes. By half-time, though, they led by two thanks to Patrick Schmidt's opener, Carl Smith's strike three minutes later and Schmidt's second five minutes before half time. David Ames added a fourth for Beeston five minutes into the second half and that proved enough for the Bees' sixth win of the season. Cannock dropped to third following their third defeat of the season at home against Surbiton. Chris Borrett, Tim Pinnock and Phil Messent had all struck for Surbiton before Ben Edge's 59th minute goal for Cannock that proved too little too late. Surbiton moved up two places into fourth thanks to their fourth win of the season.

Reading had two Nicks to thank for their point at Loughborough Students. Nick Brothers first saved Andrew Bull's 28th minute penalty stroke to keep the scores level then after Henry Weir had broken the deadlock for Loughborough in the first half it was Nick Catlin that equalised for Reading midway through the second. The scores ended in a 1-1 draw a result that sees Reading fall a place to fifth. Southgate moved a point clear of relegation after a hard fought draw with London rivals Hampstead & Westminster. Hampstead went in at half time two goals to the good through Sam Dixon and Thomas Edward's strikes. Southgate fought back and were level after 53 minutes through Johannes Kloess and Matthew Wells and though David Cooper brought hope of 3 points to Hampstead it was only five minutes later – and with nine remaining – that Simeon Bird earned a point for Southgate.

Canterbury's 3-1 win at Teddington in Conference East kept up the pressure on the sides below them and saw Wimbledon fall four points behind the leaders – in third. Teddington had started brightly and took the lead through Warren D'Souza before David Mathews equalised two minutes later to go in at half time tied at 1-1. Nathaniel Joy and Michael Farrer added a further two for Canterbury to earn their sixth victory of the season and in doing so remaining unbeaten at the halfway stage of the season. Old Loughtonians registered three points at Bromley & Beckenham in which Oliver Didham, Alex Jennings, Paul Nicholls and Josh Mephram maintained a minimum goal lead throughout to finish 4-2. Holcombe moved to within a point of defeated opponents Wimbledon on Saturday with Stephane Vehrle-Smith (two), Samuel Lund and James Stedman scoring in what appeared a one sided affair for a top of the table clash that ended 4-0. Andrew Baggs' last stand for Oxted proved in vain against City of Peterborough. Before the game clock had turned over to nine minutes, Brooklands were ahead by three goals after Mulholland's two in the fourth minute and Mark Richardson's strike. Dan Berry and David Goodfield got two back for Sheffield Hallam before half time and the spectators had been treated to an exciting half. The second half saw a further two Brooklands goals, this time from David Seddon and Dave Flanagan before Sheffield Hallam were forced to fight back again. As with the first half, Sheffield were prompted into action pulling two goals back – through Goodfield's second and Phil Roper – but the equaliser failed to materialise. Brooklands go top for the first time this season whilst Sheffield Hallam falls from first for the first time since week 2. Team Bath Buccaneers opened up a four point lead at the top of Conference West thanks to a 2-0 victory over second placed University of Birmingham. Second half goals from Shaun Matthews and Thomas Alsop were enough to earn the victory for Team Bath who has overturned a shaky start to the season. Havant lost ground on the leaders having been held to a draw by Whitchurch 1-1 at home after Andrew Pett had equalised Adam Barker's opener. Bournville remains bottom of the table despite a 2-2 draw with Cheltenham. Tom Rowland had a mixed day for Bournville, scoring the 69th minute equaliser to earn his side a point but rueing a missed penalty stroke that could so easily have earned their second win of the season. Fareham moved up a place into fifth after a 4-3 win over Cardiff & UWIC that seemed to follow the pattern of Conference West with last minute goals. This time Craig Peel, in the 68th minute, rounded off a flurry of five goals in the last ten minutes, two for Cardiff and three for Fareham, to dash the hopes of a Cardiff side that had equalised twice. A determined Dutch team gained a measure of revenge for the 5-5 draw against the Investec South Africa women's hockey team on Tuesday when they beat the girls in green and gold 5-1 in the second international amidst thick mist at Arnhem in Holland Wednesday.

The home side led 3-0 at half-time following a penalty corner from Maartje Paumen and field goals from Kitty van Male and Elen Hoog while SA were somewhat unfortunate that North West striker Sulette Damons's shot from field play hit the post and stayed out.

An SA side that included dynamic midfielder and 2011 SA Player of the Year Tarryn Bright of Western Province, enjoyed a much better second half and in-form Western Province forward Kathleen Taylor narrowed the margin via a field goal and was unlucky with another effort but Wednesday's Dutch squad demonstrated why their country is considered the world's top women's hockey nation with further goals from Daphne van der Velden and Ellen Hoog for the 5-1 victory.

SA and Southern Gauteng captain Marsha Marescia's Investec South Africa national side travel to Argentina early next month for two 4 Nations tournaments that includes hosts Las Leonas, the world's second-ranked team, before returning to SA for a marathon 16 Tests at Randburg Hockey Stadium in Johannesburg against Spain, Ireland and Belgium, beginning on January 15 and ending on February 6.

The SA national line-up then move to New Delhi in India for the all-important London 2012 Olympic Games Qualifier tournament against the likes of host nation India and other Olympic hopefuls, the Delhi competition taking place from February 15 to 26. Head coach Giles Bonnet's African champions must win this tournament if they hope to book a berth in the four-yearly Olympic showpiece that will be taking place in London in July/August next year.

PINNER READY TO FACE THE WORLD'S BEST GB KEEPER SPEAKS AHEAD OF HIS FIRST FIH WORLD LEVEL EVENT

George Pinner

Four long years after making his senior international debut at the tender age of 20, it seems likely that talented English goalkeeper George Pinner will finally be given the chance to shine at an FIH World Level event.

Following years of just missing the cut, Pinner's luck changed when Jason Lee rewarded years of intense training and sacrifice by naming him in the Great Britain squad that will challenge for

the Owen G Glenn FIH Champions Trophy, which begins next weekend in Auckland, New Zealand.

Although it has been a long wait for the now 24-year-old, the call-up is certainly not unexpected. The tall, athletic shot-stopper has been a star performer for his English club side Beeston, the current champions of England and quarter finalists in last season's Euro Hockey League. The selection is a massive boost for the Nottingham based keeper, who has been named alongside England and GB regular James Fair.



With just over one week to go until the start of the Champions Trophy in New Zealand, George talks about his excitement ahead of the tournament, his ambition to play at London 2012 and, amongst other things, his passion for chocolate.

FIH.CH: Hi George, many thanks for talking to us.

Congratulations on being selected for Owen G Glenn FIH Champions Trophy. You must be incredibly excited about the prospect of playing in your first World Level event.

GEORGE PINNER: "I am really looking forward to it. Like the rest of the squad I've been training really hard the past few weeks as well as last season so it's great to get the nod. A Champions Trophy in New Zealand is a pretty cool place to go for my first major tournament!"

FIH.CH: Are any of your friends and family coming out to New Zealand to see you in action?

GP: "Unfortunately it's just a little bit too far for people to go, especially just before Christmas. I know a lot of them will be aiming to watch the live stream from back home."

FIH.CH: What is the mood like in the GB camp ahead of the tournament? Have the preparations been going well?

GP: "It's a really exciting time to be involved with hockey in the UK, especially with the London 2012 Olympics just around the corner. Everyone in the squad is desperate to be selected come next August. This creates a really positive atmosphere in the camp as we are all working hard towards a common goal. For us, the Champions Trophy is just another rung on the ladder towards aiming to peak next August. We have been back training together as a squad since September and as our coach Jason Lee has already said we don't expect to be at our best in New Zealand. However, everyone in the squad wants to continue to be amongst the medals in the build up to 2012 so hopefully that will be the case."

FIH.CH: Many of the world's best goal-scorers will be on show in Auckland, including two winners of the FIH Players of the Year Award in Teun de Nooijer (NED) and Jamie Dwyer (AUS). As a goalkeeper, how do you feel about the possibility of facing the best strikers on the planet?

GP: "It's a really exciting prospect. I want to test myself against the best players in the world ... it's the only way to find out how good you really are. I get to train with and compete against some great players over here in England but it's always nice to test yourself against players known around the world for being the best in the business."

FIH.CH: Great Britain have been drawn into Pool B where your team will face Pakistan, Spain and world champions Australia. How do you rate your Pool B opponents?

GP: "Every team at the Champions Trophy is very good, and all of those squads probably believe that they are capable of beating anyone on their day. Australia are probably the standout team in

our group because of what they have achieved in recent years, but none of the games will be easy. Like I said, I think every team backs themselves to beat everyone else and we are no exception to that. It should be a really exciting group and tournament."

FIH.CH: The tournament in New Zealand will be the last major event for Great Britain before the London 2012 Olympic Games. Strong performances in Auckland would surely give you a fantastic chance of making that final squad for the Games. Are the players feeling pressure knowing that they are fighting for their place at the Games?

GP: "As a player you always want to perform to your best whether that is in training, a one off test match or a major tournament like the Champions Trophy. For me personally I'm pleased I have been selected having found myself as third choice for the last few tournaments, so I want to take any opportunity that I get to try and cement my position and then go from there. I think everyone is aware that the Olympics are only just around the corner and that time is running out to prove yourself. However, I don't believe people see it as negative pressure. A player's desire to make that final 16 drives them on to become better players and that has a really positive impact on the squad. The competition for places means that those who do get selected will be the best they possibly can be."

FIH.CH: So, on average, how much training are you doing on a weekly basis in the build-up to London 2012?

GP: "We train as a squad three days a week down at Bisham Abbey National Sports Centre [West of London], but also have gym sessions and club games around that. A typical week involves a gym session Monday morning either at Bisham or at the nearest English Institute of Sport gym, which for me and the other internationals from Beeston is just down the road in Loughborough. On Tuesdays we head down to Bisham again have a morning pitch session with the team before the goalkeepers have a two hour afternoon session which includes some extra speed and conditioning work. Wednesday mornings is another gym session followed by an afternoon of rest ahead of a full on Thursday and Friday. We have two pitch sessions on Thursdays; these take place on the fantastic new pitch in the Olympic Park which is really exciting. Then it's another pitch session at Bisham on Friday morning before a weights session in the afternoon. Saturday is mainly resting with some activity recovery, while Sunday is when we play our club games. We have been really lucky that an increase in our Lottery funding has meant we can all commit to a more intense training programme. This will give us the best chance of winning a medal next summer at London 2012."

FIH.CH: Finally, we understand from your team-mates that you have a passion for chocolate ... tell us more!

GP: "Yeah, for the past two years I have been working for Cadburys, who are the official treat provider of the 2012 Olympics. I actually got the job through the EIS performance lifestyle department. Cadburys wanted to help athletes progress their careers alongside their training ... I applied and was lucky enough to get a job. I had two great years but with this year's increase in training I decided to leave the company so I could focus all of my time and effort on hockey. Given the new nutrition plans we all follow leaving all the free chocolate behind probably isn't a bad thing, although a few people both in the squad and back home are pretty gutted they no longer get their chocolate fix!"

The Owen G Glenn FIH Champions Trophy takes place from 3-11 December at North Harbour Hockey Stadium in Albany, Auckland. Eight of the best teams in the world will compete – with 24 games being played over the six days of the competition.
