With a chilly start to the game, Sheffield ladies attacked Bingley Bees with confidence! Using the half court press to our advantage, Bingley Bees didn't know how to react, resulting in a 2-0 goal difference at half time with thanks to brilliant goal scorers Sophie and Claire. The rain and cold temperatures did not affect Sheffield's enthusiasm to keep a clean sheet. Fantastic commitment from the defence through to the forwards led to numerous short corners showing that Sheffield was the stronger team.

Didsbury Northern, 3-1 victors over Crewe Vagrants, might be sixth but on 21 points are only three behind leaders Alderley and seventh place Newcastle Uni are still in with a shout on 20 points.

East Grinstead continues to be the team to beat indoors having dominated the scene in recent years. Their title



winning run stretches back to the 2006-2007 season. They did however lose their first Premier Division match in three years last season when they lost to Beeston, before getting their revenge in the Super Sixes Final at Wembley Arena [video highlights] in a close encounter. Slough will once again look to make the last four as they have consistently done in recent years and they have signed Victoria Goodacre and Amanda Ferebee. Having lost to Bowdon Hightown in last season's semi finals they will hope to go one better and reach the showpiece event at Wembley.

Newcomers to the league this year are Clifton and Harleston Magpies, replacing Ipswich and Chelmsford, who were relegated at the end of last season. Both will be looking to get points on the board early on but there are no easy games. Clifton have perhaps the toughest start with matches against two of last season's semi finalists, Bowdon Hightown and Slough, on Saturday. The Magpies take on Trojans and Slough before facing up to Slough and Canterbury on Sunday. Clifton face Leicester and Trojans on Sunday.

South coast side Trojans finished three points clear of relegation last season while it could not have been tighter between Canterbury and Sutton Coldfield. Having lost out on a semi final place to Reading, those two sides are all too aware of how fine the margins will be between success and failure.

The charter states:

- We will make sport a welcome place for everyone – for those participating in sport, those attending sporting events and for those working or volunteering in sports at any level.
- We will work with all these groups to ensure they have a voice, and to challenge unacceptable behaviour.

## STATEMENT ABOUT COACHING INDEPENDENTLY



From 1st September 2012, we recommend that no coach except those licensed at UKCC Level 2, or above, should coach independently

The England Hockey Board (EHB) Coaching Group and the Hockey Coaching

Implementation Group covering Hockey across Great Britain (England, Wales and Scotland) have debated this issue at length and approved the following policy statement for hockey in England:

### BACKGROUND TO THIS POLICY

The UKCC (United Kingdom Coaching Certificate) has been developed over the last 7 years to bring parity across sports in the UK, including parity for hockey across the Home Countries.

EHB is committed to working towards all UKCC principles and standards. Our Level 1, 2, 3 & 4 Awards are UKCC Endorsed Awards, on the National Qualifications Framework and are endorsed by an Awarding Body in the same way as a degree or GCSE and A Levels.

### OLD AND NEW AWARDS

It is very difficult to align the older (pre 2004) qualifications with UKCC standards. The Hockey Association (HA) and the All England Women's Hockey Association (AEWHA) had various levels of coach awards that were merged together initially around 1994/ 5 into levels 1, 2 and 3 and clarified for the 1997 England Hockey Association (EHA) merger. Awards prior to 2004 were adequate technically and tactically but had no underpinning sports science tasks although 2002 – 2004 did include working with children. All awards gained prior to April 2004 will need some CPD (Continued Professional Development) to prove currency and compliance with UKCC qualifications. EHB are introducing in 2012 specific courses for up skilling pre April 2004 level 1 coaches.

Level 1 coaches are recommended not to coach independently and all who have taken the UKCC VRQ since April 2004 will have been informed of this position when they undertook their course.

A level 1 coach may coach a group under supervision of a level 2 or above coach

### UNDER SUPERVISION IS DEEMED AS BEING:

The level 2 coach is on the pitch or at the immediate side of the pitch and is prepared to assume responsibility in the following scenarios

- 1 Sessions where the groups are split across the pitch e.g. in 4 quarters or working in small groups in specific areas – often junior sessions
- 2 Large junior club sessions working in small groups
- 3 Level 2 or above coach working in half a pitch with a level 1 coach working in the other half with adults
- 4 Goal keeper coach working in the D with a group

### LEVEL 1 COACH SHOULD ONLY:

- 1 Lead sessions with small groups
- 2 Ideally planned by the level 2 coach
- 3 Take children to mini, Quicksticks or In2Hockey festivals and tournaments
- 4 Be responsible for warm ups, cool downs, substitutions and all game play at these festivals and matches

This is covered under match management on the level 1 course  
What happens at club sessions if the Level 2 (or above) coach is not present?

The club is advised to play practice games, small sided ideally or full pitch and a player controls the game play as an umpire. Practice games do not constitute coaching. Coaching for these purposes being - setting up drills and skill sessions and coaching players within them

What happens if coaches go to schools to deliver in curriculum

time or during extracurricular activity?

Schools are generally advised to only employ coaches for all sports who are qualified at Level 2 and above. Any coach going into schools needs to check if the school will insure, and they also need to ensure they are covered by their own insurance

A Level 1 Coach can go into a school to deliver introductory activity, however, a teacher or member of school staff is required to be present at all times to fulfill the supervisory requirements, and to learn from the coach and see the activity being delivered. In this situation the school needs to take full responsibility for insurance.

A teacher (who is not a level 1 coach) who has downloaded the relevant training packages and is insured by the school to deliver physical activity would be able to deliver activity in the school setting for lessons or club activities.

LEVEL 2 COACHES ARE TRAINED IN THE FOLLOWING:

- 1 Understanding the roles, skills qualities and ethical values of their role.
- 2 To effectively communicate and understand different learning and coaching styles.
- 3 Understand the Fundamentals of Coaching Hockey
- 4 Develop Players through Coaching Hockey
- 5 Support Players' Lifestyle through Coaching Hockey
- 6 Fitness for hockey
- 7 The principles of Safe and Equitable Coaching Practice in hockey
- 8 Planning a Series of Hockey Coaching Sessions
- 9 Preparing the Hockey Coaching Environment
- 10 Gathering information to plan hockey sessions
- 11 Plan, deliver and evaluate a series of hockey coaching sessions
- 12 Work with managers, level 1 coaching assistants and leaders

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU IF YOU ARE A LEVEL 1 COACH?

Coaches need the chance to gain the required qualifications to practice safely and independently within the UKCC requirements and to up skill by undertaking CPD. Coach Licensing, which is currently being developed with Sports Coach UK (scUK), will ensure that EHB recognises those coaches with the appropriate qualifications and give them the license to coach. Our Clubs First scheme already encourages clubs to meet minimum standards by having a qualified Level 2 coach and this has initiated many candidates attending the Level 2 courses.

WHAT SHOULD THE LEVEL 1 COACH DO IF THEY WANT TO COACH INDEPENDENTLY?

Upgrade to Level 2 in one of two ways:

- 1 Attend the full Level 2 course
- 2 Apply to do Level 2 award by Accredited Prior Experiential Learning (APEL),

Whichever upgrade route you choose, both methods require the coach to meet the full assessment criteria for the award (the success rate is highest where people complete the full Level 2 course).

TO ACHIEVE THE LEVEL 2 AWARD COACHES NEED TO COMPLETE:

- 1 A full portfolio of tasks
- 2 A successful assessment with adults
- 3 A successful assessment with children

HOW SHOULD COACHES UPGRADE?

1. Contact your regional office and ask for information (contact details can be found on the EHB website [www.englishhockey.co.uk](http://www.englishhockey.co.uk) )

2. Complete the paperwork to register including the chosen option of the two listed above
3. Return the registration form to the regional office
4. A decision will be made by EHB on the best option for each coach to help ensure you achieve the award by the most appropriate route
5. Attend the relevant training programme once the needs have been identified in each region and courses arranged

OVERVIEW OF LEVEL 1 COACHING QUALIFICATIONS FOR UKCC

The UKCC states clearly that the Level 1 Coach Award is a 'Coaching Assistant', with a role to:

'Assist more qualified coaches, delivering aspects of coaching sessions, normally under direct supervision'

By successfully completing a Level 1 coaching qualification as part of a UKCC endorsed coach education programme, coaches will be able to:

PREPARE FOR THE COACHING ACTIVITIES:

TO DO THIS, COACHES MUST BE ABLE TO:

- 1 follow safety checks and report any concerns to others
- 2 prepare and organise the equipment and venue for the activities of the coaching session
- 3 prepare participants for the activities of the coaching session

DELIVER PREPARED COACHING ACTIVITIES WITHIN SESSIONS:

TO DO THIS, COACHES MUST BE ABLE TO:

- 1 -establish working relationships with participants and others
- 2 communicate with participants to enhance motivation, enjoyment and create a positive learning environment
- 3 use coaching activities that create a fun learning environment and develop participants' performance
- 4 provide instruction and explanations to participants and others
- 5 have an awareness of how to provide feedback to participants and others

EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE COACHING ACTIVITIES:

TO DO THIS, COACHES MUST BE ABLE TO:

- 1 evaluate activities taking account of the views of the participants and others
- 2 provide feedback to others for future modifications to activities and sessions
- 3 reflect on own practice

LEVEL 1 COACH MUST HAVE THE KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING OF:

- 1 safe and ethical coaching practice
- 2 the types of communication and methods of communication to establish effective working relationships with participants and others
- 3 the techniques and skills of hockey
- 4 the rules of hockey
- 5 methods to develop participants' performance and enjoyment
- 6 adapting coaching practice to meet participants' needs, abilities and stage of development
- 7 the methods to evaluate coaching activities and reflect on personal coaching practice
