

Hallam on Track for Big Showdown

On a day when cancellation of Brooklands' game away at Belper meant that Sheffield Hallam could return to the top of the league (albeit temporarily) by beating bottom side Barford Tigers at Fortress Abbeydale, the visitors got off to the better start, belying their position in the table.

Much of this was due to the threat posed by two imports since Christmas, a Mexican international and a German import, adding both flair and pace to the Barford attack, although the absence of Sheffield's three Senior Wales internationals (playing a test match in Cardiff) was as much to blame for the disjointed start.

However having ridden the early storm, Hallam took the lead from a short corner, David Smith flicking home a rebound from Phil Roper's attempt past the despairing keeper from close range.

Other than this one moment of quality, the rest of the half was characterised by end to end action without end result, and basic passing errors from both sides. A one-nil lead at half time was fair, but was anything but convincing.

The second half was to prove unrecognisable to the first. Barford came out of the blocks sharply, and after a number of near misses, Marcus Marquardt equalised for Barford following a poor mistake as Sheffield looked to play out from the back.

There were nervous moments to follow, as it seemed as though Barford might seize the initiative and edge ahead.

However Sheffield stabilised, and kept their patience, retaining the ball for long periods and taking the momentum away from Barford.

A well-worked move down the right hand side then saw Brendan Creed's ball into the D find its way through to Will Musgrave at the far post, who finished sharply from a tight angle to regain the lead for the home side.

As we have seen countless times this season, Sheffield smelt blood, and took the game away from Barford with a blistering ten minute spell which saw further goals for the persistent Dave Goodfield and Phil Roper from the penalty spot as a Barford body blocked a goal-bound effort on the line.

The scoring was rounded off with five minutes to go, as Tom Barratt stole in to poke home his first ever National League goal.

The game ended with a yellow card a-piece as tempers flared, but the 5-1 result in the end was a fair result, even if it did not tell the story of the stern resistance put up by a Barford side that would surely not be in relegation trouble had they begun the season with their two foreign imports.

It looks as if it may be a case of too little, too late for them.

For Sheffield though, having the points on the board at the end of the day was the priority. The pressure is now on Brooklands to ensure that they don't slip up against Belper and Olton before they travel to Abbeydale in two weeks' time.

In order for this to be the promotion decider that it should be, Sheffield will have to safely navigate a tricky away tie at Belper tomorrow where three points are absolutely vital if they are to push Brooklands all the way.

Despite being behind at the break, Sheffield started the second half strong and continued to work hard, creating several more open play and short corners opportunities, which were denied due to some good clearances from the Durham keeper.

Sheffield were eventually awarded with the equaliser when Man of the Match Naomi Halladay regained possession of the ball, slipped it to Emma Fearnley who neatly converted into the bottom left corner of the goal.

Sheffield continued to fight for every ball, in search of the match. Caroline Barclay was close to scoring towards the end of the second half; however her shot was placed just wide. The game finished 1-1, and though it wasn't a win, it's a performance the ladies 1s can be proud of.

This point moves W1s back up to sixth place and but even with games in hand it looks likely that a top three spot is unlikely come the end of the season.

What this draw will do is to restart the team back to winning after lacklustre performances since the xmas break.

Only two teams have beaten Sheffield this season, and this away trip to one of them, Durham University, came with Sheffield just one point off the top of the table and needing to get a win or a draw to keep in touch with leaders Brooklands. Durham began the game five points behind Sheffield, and for them it was simple, nothing less than a win would do.

This was a very evenly matched contest, with arguably the two most well-structured sides in the league keeping each other at bay, and forcing each other to attack through tight areas. It took a quarter of an hour for the break through, Sheffield had worked hard to generate a sustained period of pressure from which a short corner was won. This was duly despatched by Phil Roper, and Sheffield had a deserved lead.

This did not last, Durham's response was immediate, piling on the pressure and creating chances. Some sloppy defending led to a short corner for Durham, which was always likely to be the main threat, and so it proved, with a clever one-two leaving Goalkeeper Cahcia little chance from close range.

Parity was maintained for the rest of the half, with neither side creating further clear scoring opportunities.

The second half was more stretched than the first, with Durham throwing everything at Sheffield. However the attacks were repelled, and some fantastic team defence meant that only one further short corner was conceded, which narrowly missed the target. As the half wore on Sheffield were the more composed side, and were becoming increasingly more threatening. A short corner was won but was deflected by the Durham runner, and it appeared as though a draw was on the cards.

However the last few minutes saw chances for both sides to take the three points. A Durham break down the right left a two-on-two,

and only last ditch defending prevented a simple tap-in for the home side. At the other end, Martin Ebbage broke free and rounded the 'keeper, only for a desperate block at the near post to deflect the ball narrowly wide from a tight angle. Finally, with the last move of the game Durham broke into the Sheffield D, but Mike Shaw did just enough to force a mis-trap from the despairing forward, and the valuable away point was secured.

With leaders Brooklands taking all three points at home to Leek, Brooklands now stand three points ahead of Sheffield, but with an inferior goal difference. Although there are two tough games to come before Brooklands visit to Sheffield, everything looks set for a thrilling title decider on St Patricks' Day at Abbeydale.

A win in this top end EHL Men's North Conference match was the main requirement for Hallam Men's 1s and failing that not to lose.

The ball was worked in to the top right of the circle from where it was hit hard to the left of the goal to Sandie Lockley whose pinpoint return pass across the face of the goal found top scorer Kath Hughes in position to tap the ball home from short range, Brooklands fortuitously equalised four minutes after Hallam had scored at their first penalty corner, the ball was injected to the top of the circle, stopped, pushed into the circle and hit at goal.

The shot went wide to the left of the goal where it hit the stick of the injector who had run in goalwards and the ball rebounded into the net.,

A rather fortunate goal, but they all count no matter how they are scored.

Hallam's penalty corner routines worked well but they were either thwarted by an on-form Brooklands keeper or by shots that just missed the target.

On another day in another game Hallam would probably score more from pc's but not in this match.

Wakefield 4s know that every week between now and the end of the season is going to be difficult.

First off, their 3rd team also play in the Yorkshire Premier Division and they have had to withdraw their sixth team from the league earlier in the season and their 5ths currently struggle to field a full side every week.

Lack of players higher up their club has meant that Wakey 4s have players playing who are not Premier Division material and their results have suffered as a consequence.

IN their 18 matches to date they have shipped 113 goals and scored only 14.

Despite that they one of four teams fighting to avoid relegation but the odds must be stacked heavily against them and it is probable that they would prefer to drop one division but may still find the same problems next season.

Hallam W2s meanwhile will welcome the chance to rack up the goals and this 10-0 win gives them a positive goal difference of +6 and seventh place, one above Wakefield's 3rd team.

The goal this season has to be to finish in the top five of the Premier Div and have a chance of moving into the North Div 2 SE being created by the reorganisation of the North League.

The current North Div 2 East will be split into Div 2 NE and Div 2 SE with the resiting teams in Div 2 East being relocated into either South East or North East groupings.

The Div 2 North East will be composed of Current North Div 2 East teams from Northumberland and Durham and be topped up by teams currently at the top end of the respective county leagues.

The Div 2 SE Division is simpler in that it will only be composed of clubs that play in the Yorkshire League so effectively becomes the top tier of women's hockey in Yorkshire whilst being part of the North League,

These two new divisions should be composed of twelve teams each and with seven possibly eight Yorkshire-based sides to form the basis of Div 2SE (LA Carnegie are currently in North Div 1 but are second bottom and they would drop into Div 2 SE if relegated) Current Yorks Premier Division teams will make up the different.

This could mean five teams moving into the new division and Sheffield Hallam 2s would want to be with them.

Fourth place finish in Yorks Prem is mathematically possible but realistically unlikely but fifth place is.

Leeds Univ 2s are in fifth on 27 points from 15 games, followed by Ben Rhydding 2s, 24 pts from 16, and Hallam 24 pts from 17. Rhydding currently have a +5 goal difference advantage over Hallam.

Of Hallam's remaining five matches three are against the top sides in the division starting with Leeds 1s this Saturday (Abbeydale Park 16.30) and on Sunday they play third place Doncaster 2s (Abbeydale Park 12.00).

Their other matches are against second-bottom Bingley Bees and Ben Rhydding 2s.

DUBLIN SET FRO OLYMPIC QUALIFIER PREVIEW: ELECTRIC IRELAND FIH ROAD TO LONDON

One of the biggest and most important hockey tournaments ever to take place on Irish soil begins this weekend as six international men's teams go into battle with one aim: win the competition and secure a place at the London 2012 Olympic Games.

The Electric Ireland FIH Road to London event – which takes place at University College Dublin – is expected to draw near capacity crowds as Korea, Malaysia, Russia, Chile, Ukraine and host nation Ireland give it everything in a bid to reach the greatest sporting show on earth.

Two weeks ago, India became the tenth men's team to qualify for London 2012 when they won the Hero FIH Road to London tournament in New Delhi, joining Great Britain, Pakistan, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Australia, New Zealand, Argentina and Spain at the competition. Next Sunday, the 11th qualifying team will be known, with the one remaining Olympic berth going to the winner of the final FIH Road to London event, which takes place later this year in Kakamigahara, Japan.

Here is a closer look at all of the teams that will compete for the title in the Electric Ireland FIH Road to London in Dublin.

Korea (World Ranking: 6th) are the highest ranked men's team yet to achieve qualification, and on their day are more than capable of beating the very best sides in the world. However, following their failure to secure Olympic qualification at the 2010 Asian Games – where Pakistan emerged triumphant – they have struggled to reach the high standards which so many expect of them. An impressive triumph ahead of Great Britain, New Zealand and Belgium in the London Cup last July suggested that the side were returning to form, but a disappointing eighth place finish at the Owen G Glenn FIH Champions Trophy at the end of 2011 was a blow to Korean confidence. Despite this, Korea rightly go into the

tournament as favourites to claim the place at the London 2012 Olympics, which is hardly surprising when you consider the world class talent that the team has at its disposal. Nine of the players in the squad have over 150 caps to their name, with star striker and captain Seo Jong Ho having played 265 times for his country. If Seo is on form, Korea will take some stopping here in Dublin.

Following their second place finish to Pakistan at the Asian Games in 2010, **Malaysia** (World Ranking: 13th) have a second bite at the Olympic Qualification cherry at the Dublin Road to London event. The team – captained by Mohd Madzli Ikmar Mohd Nor, a player who has made well over 300 international appearances for his country – come into this tournament determined to reach their first Olympic Games since Sydney 2000, where they finished in 11th place. Like Korea, their recent form has been mixed, a point marked by their fifth place finish at the FIH Champions Challenge 1 which took place in December in Johannesburg, South Africa. A recent 1-0 defeat against 27th ranked Wales suggests that they are still struggling for form, but this team possesses more than enough quality to mount a serious challenge for that elusive place at the London 2012 Games. One player to watch is Tengku Ahmad Tajuddin Tengku Abdul Jalil, a striker who has a habit of scoring spectacular and often crucial goals for his team.

The men of **Ireland** (World Ranking: 16th) have made huge strides forward in recent years. South African coach Paul Revington has forged a talented group of young players into a formidable team that is both defensively strong and extremely dangerous on the attack. Revington's charges achieved a creditable 5th place finish at last year's EuroHockey Nations Championship, notching up an impressive 8-2 victory over fellow Olympic qualification hopefuls Russia before inflicting a 3-2 defeat on Spain, the Silver medalists at Beijing 2008. The team is captained by Ronan Gormley, an accomplished defender who plays his club hockey for Spanish giants Club de Campo de Madrid, a team that reached the final of the Euro Hockey League in 2011. Gormley is one of 12 Irish internationals playing club hockey overseas, with others including Conor and David Harte (SCHC – The Netherlands), Chris Cargo (Reading HC – England), and dangerous forward Eugene Magee, who represents Belgian champions KHC Dragons. A recent 3-0 series whitewash against Czech Republic included a dazzling 9-0 triumph, proving that the tournament hosts are in fine form coming into this event.

20th ranked **Russia** arrive in Dublin with a good blend of youth and experience. The youngest player is talented 19-year-old Semen Matkovskiy, who is almost half the age of talismanic striker and captain Aleksandr Platonov. Despite being 37, Platonov is still an incredibly powerful, dangerous forward who is capable of creating goals out of nothing. Alexander Zhirkov is Russia's stand-out player both indoors and outdoors. His skill and creativity could be key to Russian dreams of reaching a first Olympic Games since being part of the Unified Team which took part in Barcelona 1992.

Chile (World Ranking: 26th) may not be considered amongst the favourites taking part in the Electric Ireland FIH Champions Trophy, but they have proven over the last 12 months that they are a team that is rapidly developing. The South Americans grabbed a third place finish at the Pan American Games, cruising to victories over Barbados (9-1), Trinidad & Tobago (3-1) and Cuba (4-3) to claim their second successive bronze medal at the competition. Penalty corner expert Jan Richter netted six times during the competition, and will be a dangerous weapon for Chile here in Dublin. Another player to watch is Alexis Berczely, a skillful forward who regularly finds the back of the net for his team.

Ukraine (World Ranking: 29th) are another fast improving team, and are certainly not attending this tournament purely to make up the numbers. They have their sights set firmly on the task of achieving Olympic Qualification, and will not be taken lightly by any of their opponents. The team is coached by Pavlo Mazur and captained by 36-year-old defender Ruslan Pashovskyy, who will be hoping to lead his national hockey team to a first ever appearance at an Olympic Games. At 40 years of age, defender Sergii Suprun is the oldest player in the competition.

The Electric Ireland FIH Road to London Men's Olympic Qualifying

tournament gets underway on Saturday 10th March, which will feature the first set of Round-Robin matches. Malaysia and Chile take to the field at 12:00pm (UTC / GMT), before host nation Ireland taking on Russia at 2.30pm. The final match of the day begins at 5.00pm when tournament favourites Korea face a Ukraine team that sits 23 places below them in the current FIH World Rankings.

TWO IN THREE FOR BATH BUCCS

The first title was secured at the weekend with Team Bath Buccaneers winning Conference West with others set to go to the wire.

Surbiton secured a vital victory in the Investec Conference East Championship chase by defeating second place St. Albans' 1-0 on Sunday. Having suffered defeat to Chelmsford last weekend, Surbiton bounced back with two victories over Old Loughtonians on Saturday, 3-0, followed by the win over St. Albans that saw their opponents drop to third. Though St. Albans had won 3-0 at home against Maidstone on Saturday, wins against Oxford Hawks and Maidstone – 3-0 and 5-0 – for Sevenoaks saw the Kent side move up into second at the expense of St. Albans. Sevenoaks trail Surbiton by four points with three games to play which places Surbiton firmly in the driving seat.

At the bottom, Maidstone lost both their fixtures against title chasers which meant Horsham pulled within three points following their 1-1 draw with Harleston Magpies, however, they were unable to capitalise any further on Sunday having suffered a 3-0 defeat by Chelmsford. A day earlier, Chelmsford faced Ipswich as sixth met seventh in a 1-1 stalemate.

Investec Conference North experienced a glut of goals including leaders Beeston who put seven past Doncaster. Hannah Wraith scored twice for Beeston as her side ran out 7-1 winners and it was an important result as Durham University closed ground in the leaders with victories over Liverpool Sefton and Wakefield Bradford. Durham trail Beeston by just two points with nine on offer for the remainder of the season. Loughborough fell five points behind the leaders having won on Saturday against Whitley Bay & Tynemouth but succumbed to a 3-2 defeat by Doncaster on Sunday in which Charlotte Tomlin scored twice for Doncaster.

Northampton Saints lost their thirteenth fixture of the season in emphatic fashion as Wakefield Bradford breezed past them in a 10-0 scoreline, although mathematically possible to avoid relegation altogether, practically the best they can hope for this season is a place in the relegation play-offs. Saints sit nine points adrift of safety with an inferior goal difference by 33 goals from Liverpool Sefton. Springfields, in ninth, lost 4-2 at home against Brooklands Poynton to remain three points adrift of safety but six points ahead of Northampton Saints.

Buckingham continues to lead Investec Conference West by four points over Swansea after their 2-1 win over Gloucester City thanks to goals from Leanne Grimsley and Katrina Nicholson. Swansea also secured three points on Saturday with a 5-2 win inspired by Carys Hopkins' brace, over Firebrands.

Team Bath Buccaneers, at the foot of the table, equalised twice against Barnes Hounslow Ealing through Kirsty Hoskins and Zoe Shipperley to earn their third draw of the season. Since Exe lost 1-0 away at local rivals Isca University – Claire Thomas' goal the winner – Team Bath Buccaneers trail the relegation play-off place by just two points. Exe still trail Staines, and safety, by three points following Staines' 4-3 loss at home against Trojans, Nyssa Cole scoring twice for the visitors.
