Bowdon 2s who were their opponents at Abbeydale Park last Saturday are currently second in the North Premier Division but even though they could win the league they cannot win promotion as club 2nd teams are not allowed in the national league.

While the 5-2 defeat Hallam suffered at the hands of Bowdon will not do Bowdon any good in terms of promotion it is the lose of points to teams at the top end of the table that will hurt Hallam.

Ben Rhydding, who comfortably beat Whitley Bay & Tynemouth 2nds 6-2, are top now five points ahead of third-place Hallam and look to be the team to beat.

It's a long way to the end of the season and has already been seen in this league results don't always go by the form book.

Hallam will need to look to their laurels form now on to ensure that Rhydding do not disappear into the distance and an away match at second-bottom Bolton is just what the doctor ordered to end Hallam's mini run of two defeats.

Hallam started well against Bowdon attacking with purpose and speed but it was not attack that proved Hallam's undoing although ultimately its goal that win games it was defensive errors that cost them dear.

A series of bad clearances, sometimes passing the ball right straight to opponents created unnecessary pressure on the Hallam back line and it was one such clearance that led to Bowdon's first goal on 20 minutes.

Hallam were without defensive mainstay Michelle Daniel and when Nicole Perkins had to leave the field midway through the first half with a nasty ankle injury Hallam were totally without the core of their normal strong defence.

Add to this the absence of midfield general Emma Fearnley and Hallam were deep in defensive trouble.

Another absentee was their young goal-scoring forward Tori Wensley who was playing in the Futures Cup for the Pennine Pumas in a regional competition from which the squads for this year's England junior sides would be selected.

It wasn't all doom and gloom in the first period as when Hallam did get the ball into midfield they still had sufficient strength to create trouble for the somewhat flat-footed Bowdon defence.

Leading scorer Kath Hughes scored another of her trademark penalty corner goals stealing in at the near post to deflect the ball home from close range and the scorer stayed at an encouraging 1-1 until half time.

After the break Hallam continued where they left on in the first period with Caroline Barclay, the best player on the pitch, causing Bowdon all sorts of problems with her pace.

It was not a bad play from Hallam that let Bowdon in for their second goal but an umpiring decision in favour of Bowdon, that on another day would have gone Hallam's way, led to a quick decisive two touch finish.

One minute later Hallam were reeling and 3-1 down following a quick break from Bowdon who quickly gained possession almost from the restart and ten seconds later the ball was once again in

Hallam's net.

Kath Hughes once again reduced the deficit to 3-2 with a carbon copy of her first goal although the ball she deflected was travelling much faster that first time round.

Unfortunately as often happens Hallam were having to chase the game and pressing in attack and were caught on the break conceding an penalty corner which was well put away by Bowdon.

4-2 down, ten minutes to play, then eight minutes left and another dubious penalty corner leading to a fifth goal from Bowdon.

Hallam did have a string of penalty corners in the final five minutes and Bowdon, under extreme pressure, were grateful just to clear the ball anywhere but the ball would not go in the net and Hallam will just have to put this one down to experience and look forward to picking themselves up next week.

LEICESTER LADIES & GB HOCKEY STAR DIANE BATTERHAM HAS DIED

It is with great sadness that the EHB has to report the death of Di Batterham who died at the weekend, aged 71, after a long and brave battle against cancer.

Di spent her domestic playing career at Leicester Ladies and did a huge amount for hockey in both her home county and for her country. She played for England seven times in 1971 and then went on to manage a very successful Great Britain ladies team from 1987-1992 alongside coach Dennis Hay. This included fourth place in the Seoul Olympics in 1988 and a Bronze medal in Barcelona in 1992.

Gaynor Nash (Leicester HC), David Cawthorn (Leicestershire & Rutland Hockey Association) and Mary Nevill (GB Captain Barcelona 1992) all worked closely with Di throughout her years in hockey and we are very grateful to them for sharing some memories about the times they spent together:

Leicester HC

As a local (Leicester) girl, Di played hockey for club, county, territory and country but her greatest achievement was as the player-friendly manager of the Great Britain women's hockey team that won bronze in Barcelona in 1992. Jane Sixsmith and Mary Nevill might have been the stars but Di contributed so much to the spirit of the side.

Di taught locally at Stonehill High School for many years, inspiring many a young girl to play hockey. She also served county schoolgirls and the women's association in many capacities, most recently as long-serving Treasurer of the women's hockey section.

Di was a key figure at Leicester Ladies throughout the 60s and 70s and even nearing the end of her career she remained rock solid at the back, able to read the game brilliantly and with superb distribution skills.

Golf has been Di's passion for the last thirty years but she retained a great affection for club and county hockey and her death leaves all who knew her saddened, but all the richer for having known such a character. *Gaynor Nash, Leicester Ladies Hockey Club.*



The game actually took place back in May of this year, but it took Guinness World Records some time to assess all the evidence that the club gathered together in support of their world record attempt.

The evidence gathering and patience eventually paid off and SGHC are now official Guinness World Record holders for playing the longest continuous hockey match in history, beating the previous record set in August 2010 by Omagh Hockey Club in Ireland, by 45 minutes.

The match took place at Bradley Stoke Community School, and involved two squads of 16 players. They were supported by an army of volunteer stewards, umpires, independent witnesses, timekeepers and lots of family and friends.

The event was organised by the hockey club's third-team goalkeeper Darren Bane, whose son Matthew was born more than three months early, and spent his first six months at NICU.

Speaking after the event Darren said, "Waiting for Guinness to officially confirm our world record claim was almost as painful as taking part in the match itself. It has been a very anxious few months of waiting, but now they have officially recognised our achievement, we are all delighted. The main reason for the endurance event was to raise as much money as we could for a very worthy cause, which will help save lives. But the fact that we have made a little piece of history for ourselves is the icing on the cake, and a memorable reward for the huge amount of effort put in, not just by the players but the many supporters.

The club would like to say thank you to everyone that supported them on the day, without their collective effort and support they would not have been able to achieve the new world record.

Men's England Hockey League Premier Division

East Grinstead's six point haul from a fortnight ago helped them to the top of the table ahead of this Sunday's clash with Bowdon. Exeter's students lost the battle of the students that same weekend when they went down 5-3 to their Loughborough counterparts in a match in which England defender Richard Smith scored twice. Surbiton are Loughborough Students' opponents this weekend with the two teams locked together on seven points just outside the playoff spots. Surbiton were the other casualty of East Grinstead's double victory weekend having rallied back from 3-0 down to level at 3-3 before Danny Hall and Will Arthur made sure for EG. But they will be pleased that international forward Matt Daly is still the joint leading scorer in the division with five goals.

Men's England Hockey League Conference North

SHEFFIELD HALLAM finally saw their unbeaten start come to a halt in Men's EHL Conference North two weeks ago when rivals University of Durham came calling. The students recorded a 3-1 victory thanks to goals from Matthew Hodgson, Mark Galloway and Daniel Coultas. The result propelled Durham to within two points of the leaders, although Sheffield Hallam remain top after second placed Brooklands MU let slip the lead to draw 3-3 at Leek. Despite all of that excitement it was Deeside Ramblers and Preston that served up the biggest treat as they played out a 6-6 draw. Defences were certainly not on top as they went in at the break with

Preston 4-3 up, having been 3-0 up inside nine incredible first half minutes. Ibrar Latif's 68th minute penalty stroke, his fourth goal of the match, ensured a share of the spoils for Deeside Ramblers who sit ninth. This week the Ramblers head to the University of Durham while Preston, who scored a third of their season's goal haul in the match, are at home to mid table Doncaster. Barford Tigers, bottom with just one point from a possible 18, are at home to table topping Sheffield Hallam while Brooklands MU and Belper will meet in the north west. Both Olton and West Warwicks and Leek will see the opportunity of taking maximum points when they meet in the final tie this weekend.

Men's England Hockey League Conference East

24 hours after Canterbury's 1-1 draw with Holcombe, Indian Gymkhana pulled level at the top of Men's EHL Conference East as they ran out 4-3 winners at City of Peterborough. With Wimbledon and Old Loughtonians just a point behind the leading two it's tight at the top. For that reason, Indian Gymkhana and Old Loughtonians could be considered as having the toughest weekend this week as they meet each other. Third placed Wimbledon go to Harleston Magpies having beaten Teddington 1-0 a fortnight ago while league leaders Canterbury are at Bromley and Beckenham, who lost 1-0 at Oxted last time out. At the bottom of the table, Bournville will be desperate to kick start their season when they host Whitchurch, who will be just as keen to halt their slide. Bournville are yet to pick up a point in the opening six matches of the season; the Midlands' latest result was a 3-1 defeat at ninth placed Lichfield, which put a six point gap between the two sides. Lichfield's opponents this weekend are Cardiff & UWIC, who would find themselves drawn into the basement battle if Lichfield were to pick up points there. Although they lost 2-1 to rivals Havant two weeks ago, Fareham can still claim two of the league's top scorers in Craig Peel and James Seager. The Hampshire side will have its work cut out on Sunday hosting Team Bath Buccaneers, who like Havant sit just two points off top spot.

In the Investec Women's Premier Division, top plays bottom on Sunday as Cannock make the trip south to Berkshire to face a Reading side flying high with six wins from six. If last season is anything to go by supporters at Sonning Lane could be in for a treat. A strange pair of results last season saw Reading beat their opponents 6-2 in the corresponding fixture but lose 5-3 in Staffordshire. And there were plenty of goals on show when Reading hosted Sutton Coldfield a fortnight ago; 11 in total as Reading ran out 9-2 winners with Great Britain Olympian Alex Danson on target four times while Jessica Brooker scored her first goal for Reading. Reading versus Cannock is part of a Reading-Cannock double header that also sees their two clubs' men's teams clash in the Men's England Hockey League.

Those results mean it's still level pegging at the top of the table going into the weekend when Surbiton host ninth placed Old Loughtonians and St Albans travel to Kent to play eighth placed Maidstone. The other Kent side in the Conference, Sevenoaks, are still within touching distance of the top ahead of their trip to Oxford Hawks, for whom Tacita Haines is top scorer with four goals. Horsham will look to build some momentum having won their first point two weeks ago and they will have a chance against a Harleston Magpies side that has won three, drawn one and lost two of its opening six games. ABBASI STRIKES LATE TO SINK KOOKABURRAS

Pakistan earned an impressive win over Australia on Thursday.

The Kookaburras have faltered in their final match of the 3 Nations tournament involving Pakistan and India, going down to Pakistan 4-3 overnight in Perth.

With Australia going into the match undefeated throughout the series, Pakistan took it up to the Kookaburras, confirming that they are a difficult team and capable of defeating higher ranked teams on any given day.

Although it was the Kookaburras who made the best start thanks to a field goal to Simon Orchard at the 15 minute mark, Pakistan took the first half honours, scoring two consecutive goals late in the half to take a one goal lead into half time.

After an even 10 minutes after half time the Kookaburras responded, with penalty corner specialist Chris Ciriello levelling the game via a penalty corner goal to make it 2-2.

However once again it was Pakistan who again took it up to the world number one team, scoring two more goals late in the half to take a commanding lead.

A late goal to Chris Ciriello brought some respectability to the score board but it was too late to get the Kookaburras back in the game. In the earlier game, Australia A defeated India 2-1.

Despite the loss the Kookaburras will take a lot out of the series as they now focus their attention towards the 2011 Champions Trophy which will be held in Auckland, New Zealand from December 3-11. As well as playing some good hockey over the last month which has seen them win the Oceania Cup and Lanco International Super Series, perhaps more importantly they have got some game time into previously injured players including Des Abbott, Jamie Dwyer, Tim Deavin and Mark Knowles.

The Kookaburras are the most successful team in Champions Trophy history and if they win in 2011, they will become the first team in history to win the Champions Trophy four times in a row. Furthermore as the tournament will be the last major international hockey event prior to the 2012 London Olympics, it will give coach Ric Charlesworth a chance to assess where the Kookaburras are currently placed against the other top nations.
